

TWO 20-24 September 2011

The Warehouse Studio Theatre

Rehearsals are coming to a close for *Two* and all is well. Ruth (England) and Rory (Harvey-Kelly) have both managed to master their seven roles each in Jim Cartwright's masterpiece slice of Northern life and are ready to present it to the audiences in Brussels (20-24 September) and in Bedford (30 September - 1 October). The play is being directed by Conrad Toft, with Sue Botterell as stage manager, lighting from Carsten Koester and costumes by Iona Hamilton.

The process has been a hard slog at times, as Rory says, "the rehearsals have felt like an extended workshop. I appreciate the intense focus that is possible for two actors plus director to achieve". They have been working through the summer on the production. Rory notes that "it has been great to have almost all rehearsals in the Studio. Developing an intimate knowledge of the theatre has been beneficial to exploit the required choreography to the maximum." And choreography is the word - the two actors have to keep the action going on- and off-stage, while changing their costumes and personalities in the wings.

For those of you who have seen Ruth in any of her many previous roles, you will know that she is an actress with boundless energy and a huge amount of talent and experience. Even she has found the rehearsal process daunting: "This is one of the most challenging roles I have ever undertaken, as the choreography of movement is paramount. We are fortunate to have a director who knows what he wants and has the ability to demonstrate his vision to us. *Two* is a terrific play and rehearsals are really enjoyable although, frankly, exhausting."

A detailed study in lies, class judgments and repressed passions, Separate Tables by Terrence Rattigan consists of two connecting plays. Set in a private hotel in mid-1950s Bournemouth, it explores the seedy gentility of the long-term guests who live by the strict social rules of a bygone era, obliged to take meals at individual tables, symbolizing the isolation of each. In the first play, a down-at-heel journalist is confronted by his ex-wife, who once provoked him to a violent act that sent him to prison and ruined him. In the second play a bogus army Major and dowdy neurotic girl with a ruthless domineering mother are drawn to each other, even when scandal breaks. In both plays the hotel manager acts as the catalyst to resolve the issues.

The production will take place in the Warehouse Studio Theatre 28 Feb – 10 March 2012 and will run for 10 performances. Scripts will be distributed before Christmas and rehearsals will be an intensive 4 times a week starting mid January. There are roles for 8 women, 4 men. The production is also looking for backstage help.

The ECC and Rattigan A small correction

Barbara Blackwell writes:

"Thank you for the ECCO ... May I put the record straight? Blackie was the lead in the first ECC postwar play in May 1948, two weeks before our wedding, so I was into the Club's activities very early on!! The play was Rattigan's "While the Sun Shines" which was quite appropriate at the time ... it would be fun to read [Rattigan] in this 100th year."

On Friday 3 June, Le Soir published an article about 'Am Dram' in Brussels ...

Here is a (non-professional) translation:

In Brussels close to a dozen amateur theatre groups perform pieces in English, but also in Spanish, Hungarian or in Swedish, and sometimes in several languages at the same time. Let's meet them in the wings.

The English Comedy Club may be the oldest British (amateur theatre) company on the continent. "It was founded more than 100 years ago, and has never stopped performing, except during the Second World War" explained Rachel Cuff, member of the ECC Committee – a voluntary group as is the norm in the amateur theatre world. Lawyer by day, specialising in competition law, actress by night, Rachel has lived in Brussels for 9 years. "I did not expect to find a theatrical life here of such intensity, so international and energetic. When you rehearse 3 or 4 times a week with the same people for 2 months, you end up making new friends. Like a lot of expatriates, I have found a family in the theatre.

Following the example of other companies such as The Brussels Shakespeare Society, The Irish Theatre Group or The American Theatre Company, The ECC produces 3 or 4 productions each year. Its members – actors, set builders, technicians – are aged between 20 and 70 years old. They work for the European organisations, are language teachers, accountants and IT workers. "The public is two-thirds anglophone, but many nationalities work on our productions. And we would like to attract more Belgians", said Rachel.

The English company (sic) has its own premises at 69A rue Waelhem, in Schaerbeek, which is close to place Verboekhoven at chaussée de Helmet. In 1994 the ECC, together with the ATC and ITG purchased an old industrial building. With a clubroom, two rehearsal rooms, storage space and, above all, a theatre seating 65, today the Warehouse Studio Theatre swarms with activities.

"The small size of the Studio often allows more intensive theatrical experiences" notes Noel Griffin, who works with the ITG. Originally from Belfast, Noel came to Brussels to work for the Northern Ireland authorities. "I had a taste of the theatre as an adolescent, but it is here that I refound it following an advertisement for an audition. I won a small role, then another and I now perform in 3 pieces a year. The diary of Anglophone theatrical events is so full that it is difficult to follow everything".

A mixture of experienced and new actors

Founded in 1982, the ITG offers classical and modern Irish theatre. Here, like elsewhere, directors and actors mix together during projects and auditions. "But we always try to have a mixture of experienced and new actors" emphasises Noel.

If the Anglophones seem to dominate the expatriate theatrical world, more recent initiatives have come from the Hungarian and Greek communities. The company Teatro.be, which took over from Atanino in 2005, alternates classical and contemporary works from the Hispanic repertoire, with a conspicuous taste for Federico García Lorca. It performs in L'Espace Scarabeus, rue Creuse in Schaerbeek. "The majority of actors and technicians come from Spain or Latin America, but it suffices to speak the language to join us. The public is like elsewhere extremely mixed" say Ester Poso Vera and Carmen Falkenberg Ambrosio.

Still very young, the company ETCetera plays on its part the multilinguistic card. Its recent *Hamlet Unplugged* alternated monologues in English, French, German, Spanish and Swedish ... all with surtitles. "The objective is to bring people to performances in a language other than their own" explained Peter Willis. The company notably organises evenings during which three one-act plays are performed, each in a different language and always with surtitles. "Our public is actually mostly Hispanic and Francophone, but little by little we are attracting the new communities, notably from Central Europe" he continued.

All the companies agree: all willing volunteers are very welcome, whether on the stage or to offer help back stage. It's not a bad way to practice a different language is it?




