





Move Over Mrs Markham

A Completely Unbiased Review by Sara Hammerton

I have a confession to make. I was a bit cynical about the idea of an old-fashioned 1970s bedroom farce which, as director Hugh Dow proudly announced, had "no redeeming social merit whatsoever". How would it go down with a sophisticated, modern Brussels audience? Extremely well is the answer.



I had of course decided to see it anyway and put cynicism aside, but I didn't even need to. By the time I saw *Move Over Mrs Markham*, I had heard so many positive comments about it – not to mention the flurry of enthusiastic postings on Facebook – that I was eagerly anticipating an evening of fun, and that is just what we got.

The plot involves three different couples all scheming to use the same bed in the same flat on the same night, and naturally chaos ensues. Mrs Markham, played by Nicole Freund, has reluctantly agreed to allow her friend Linda Lodge (Laura Smith) to use the flat for an extramarital affair, while Mr Markham has also agreed to allow Linda's husband, his business partner, to do the same - unaware of course that the interior decorator was planning to get the au pair (Margarete Rudzki) into the same bed. Then in walks renowned author Olive Harriet Smythe (Sandra Lizioli) to sign a potentially financially rewarding deal, having left her previous publishing house because she strongly disapproves of sexual shenanigans. Panic. And they did it so well. Timing is crucial to make a piece like this work, and the whole cast had it absolutely nailed. There were excellent, comic performances all round, which soon had the audience giggling, all the more so because the cast were so obviously enjoying themselves. Then the giggles turned to belly laughs thanks to the Laurel and Hardyesque pairing of Rory Harvey-Kelly as the rather bewildered Philip Markham and his philandering – and much taller – business partner Henry Lodge, played by Chris Jones.

Another visual treat was the set – created by set-builder *extraordinaire* Philip Deeks, together with Marie Horner. In addition to creating the illusion of two rooms and three entrances, it included an oval bed, a very 70s style swivel chair, and avocado walls (remember those bathroom suites?). Nor did the costumes disappoint. Arash Saffarzadell's portrayal of the flamboyant interior designer Alistair Spendlow was given extra flair thanks to his shiny off-white suit, and then there was my personal favourite, the 1970s smock-style dress worn by Laura Smith as Linda Lodge. It must be real vintage. I'm sure I had something like it when I was about 12....

It had been a week of grey weather and even gloomier economic forecasts, so to have an evening of light-hearted fun was just what was needed. Well done to the whole cast and crew and particularly Hugh for choosing the piece in the first place.

ECC MEMBERSHIP NEWS

NEW MEMBERSHIP RULES

Lyn Wainwright, Membership Secretary, writes:

At the AGM it was proposed that the collection of dues for membership of the English Comedy Club should be terminated. All paid-up members at the meeting voted unanimously to adopt this proposal.

The main reason for the change is an attempt to simplify the system and to adopt an approach which is already in operation in many other theatre groups. In addition it was felt that as communication is now almost entirely electronic the cost of the Newsletter (ECCO) is the same regardless of the number sent and that charging people really makes no sense.

At the moment members pay ≤ 10 and receive a ≤ 2 reduction on the ticket price. As we never produce five shows each season it is impossible for the members to recoup their investment.

There is also a proposal on the table to change our box office arrangements, and this would require a single ticket price.

A Membership Mailing List will be created which will contain all the names, addresses and participation details of those who were paid-up members in 2011/2012.

A small number of members have already paid for 2012/2013 and they will be entitled to the usual reductions on ticket prices and they will also be added to the Membership Mailing List.

Anyone applying to join the ECC in future should complete the form which appears on our website and their details will be added to the Membership Mailing List.

Members will only need to complete a new form if their contact details change or if they wish to remove their name from the list.
