## **Welcome – From your ECCO Editor**



On behalf of the club I wish you all a very (early) Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!



Publicity is one of the vital ingredients in the success of our productions: it is so frustrating when you hear people say 'Oh, I'd have LOVED to have seen that' when it's too late! Femke, the *Aladdin* publicity person, is seeking help in spreading the word – and maybe you can help out too! Femke is encouraging people to tweet about our panto! **Femke writes:** Here's what you can do (/ keep on doing):

- 1) a general tweet mentioning @AladdinECC and the link to the tickets. For example: Come and see #AladdinBrussels the Panto! Check @AladdinECC and book tickets here http://goo.gl/wyBPq3
- 2) a Follow Friday (#FF) a tweet on Friday whereby you recommend @AladdinECC to your followers. For example: Friday's here: Today's #FF goes to @AladdinECC I can't wait for their #panto in January
- 3) "spotted!" Tweets. For instance if you see the Aladdin posters in the European Commission or the Parliament (or Stonemanor) take a picture and tweet it mentioning @AladdinECC. Other things you can do:

# **TALKING HEADS**

## **Reviewed by Graham Andrews**

Talking Heads was originally written by Alan Bennett, in 1987 and 1988, to be performed as a series of monologues on BBC television, with actors talking directly into camera. They have all since been adapted for both the professional and amateur stage. The recent production by the ECC was a resounding success – and I'm here to tell you why.

Alan Bennett has been described as England's "National Teddy Bear"<sup>1</sup>, probably because of his cuddly and diffident public persona, but he doth practise to deceive. The 'talking head' characters run the gamut from Rupert to Pudsey, with a Grizzly bear thrown in from time to time. It reminds me of the Irish style of monologue, in which the **shanachie** (storyteller: pronounced shan-a-kee) holds an audience spellbound with a mixture of folksy humour, pathos, and wee thinky bits.

The three stories chosen for this production have surprises in store, mostly in terms of slow and subtle emotional development. From entrance to exit lines, the cast made their characters seem like real human beings, with their own unique stories to tell, not actors reciting lines written by a know-it-all author. I sensed a one-on-one connection between actors and audience.

In *Lady of Letters* (directed by Joanna Patrick), Sara Hammerton portrayed Irene Ruddock, a writer of poison pen letters to anyone whom she hopes to enlist in her self-righteous moral crusade against her neighbours in particular and the world in general. Irene does get her legal comeuppance, but – after leaving prison – she just takes up where she had left off. Some people never learn!

Rachel Cuff played Muriel in *Soldiering On*, directed by Jonathan Stockwell. She made pitch-perfect transitions from relentless good humour to moments of horrible truth. The death of Muriel's husband and subsequent bad investments – or worse – by her son, Giles, have resulted in painfully reduced circumstances. But there is no wallowing in self-pity: "I'm not that sort of woman."

Ailsa Higgins obviously relished the role of Lesley, an aspiring young actress, in *Her Big Chance* (directed by Mark Prescott). Lesley lands a featured extra role, as a blonde bombshell called 'Travis', in what she takes to be a European art movie. But she gradually turns into the kind of 'starlet' who will only take her kit off if the scenes are essential to the plot – and done in the best possible taste.

Fiona 'Boff' Muir excelled as producer and stage manager. There was an effectively simple set, designed by Conrad Toft, with minimal furniture and a selection of props (thanks to Fiona McGinnis, who doubled as Costume Lady) that were appropriate to whichever character was on stage at the time. Cecelia Flett kept the sound at a calm conversational level. The lighting, by Lyn Wainwright and Barbara Daw was — ahem — spot on.

#### We will be meeting Chez Mary

**Graham writes:** Nowhere is Agatha Christie's remarkable ingenuity more evident than in her adaptation of *Witness for the Prosecution*. The short story of the same title is seemingly perfect and complex, with a stunning final revelation that lifts the reader off the chair. Yet for the stage version Dame Agatha devised still another revelation beyond that one, an entirely plausible surprise that not only makes for an electrifying curtain but at the same time legitimizes what would otherwise have been a necessary deception in the list of characters.
